Motivation

- In *Sarmento et al.* [TSA 2009]:
 - Extraction of **opinions** about relevant **political actors** from **comments** posted by readers to an on-line newspaper
 - Precision of detected **positive opinions** is much **lower** (~60%) than detected negative opinions (~ 90%)
 - One of the major sources of error (~35% of the cases) is related to **verbal irony**
- Is **verbal irony automatically detectable in comments?**

Verbal Irony


- Rhetorical process of **intentionally** using words or expressions for uttering a **distinct meaning from the literal**
- May be expressed by a variety of **figurative devices**
 - sarcasm, hyperbole, rhetorical questions, jocularity, ...
(differences may be hard to distinguish in practice)
- We refer to irony as **the use of a word or expression with prior positive polarity for expressing a negative opinion in *secondary orality***

Secondary Orality

[Ong, 1982]

- ***Writing as talking*** in interpersonal communication
 - Short, reactive comments
 - Expression of immediate emotions
 - Relaxed writing style
 - Usage of symbolic combinations of characters and other iconographic symbols
- **Irony is fair game**
 - Represented in secondary orality in a very explicit way


Detecting Irony in Portuguese UGC

Main Conclusions

This **exploratory work** shows that:

- Ironic opinions are detectable in comments
 - Relatively simple linguistic clues are effective
- Ironic constructions are frequently signaled by “oral” clues in secondary orality

Future Work

- Improve precision by considering different clues in combination
 - ironic sentences usually contain more than one linguistic evidence
- Improve automatic reference corpus annotation by using the irony detection rules in polarity assignment and propagation
- More comprehensive study of other uses of irony:
 - other manifestations of secondary orality
 - diverse social media
 - multiple languages
